



The history of Bihar can be traced back to the dawn of civilization when the enlightened intellectuals of the soil carried and spread the light of wisdom far and wide. Bihar's socio-cultural benevolence is in the constellation of monasteries and shrines of Hindus, Buddhists, Jains, and Sikhs which scintillate architectural grandeur of the past. The University of Nalanda, was one of the world's oldest seats of learning. During this period the reign of the Guptas dynasty was heralded as the Golden Age of India when science, mathematics, astronomy, philosophy and religion received regal impetus and were pursued with enthusiasm. Etymologically, Bihar derives its name from the Sanskrit word 'VIHARA', meaning 'abode' or 'monastery'.

Patna, the capital of Bihar, is one of the oldest continuously inhabited places in the world. One school of thought believes it to have derived from the Sanskrit word "pattan", meaning 'port' as the city was located as a thriving river port near the confluence of four rivers (Ganges, Sone, Punpun and Gandak). Another belief is that the city derived its name from "Patan Devi", the city's presiding deity. Yet another legend associates its origin to Putraka, a mythological king, who created the city by magic for his beloved queen Patali and, in honour of the queen's first born named it as 'Patliputra'. The city is mentioned as 'Palibothra' or 'Palimbotra' in the writings of Greek historian Megasthenes and as 'Pa-lin-fou' in the records of Chinese traveller Fa-hien.

The city's history dates back to 684 B.C. when the Haryanka dynasty wielded power. Patna or Patliputra has figured as the capital for the mighty empires of the Nanda, the Maurya, the Gupta and the Vardhana dynasty. They ruled over a vast region of the Indian Subcontinent. Megasthenes, the Greek Ambassador to the Court of Chandragupta Maurya and many Chinese travellers, including Fa-hien and Huen-Tsang, in their travelogues have spoken in glowing terms of the peace and prosperity that prevailed in the region.

Patliputra is the birthplace of the great Mauryan Emperor, Ashoka, and Guru Gobind Singh, the tenth Guru of Sikhs. During the 17th century, Patna became a centre of international trade, with the British starting a factory in Patna in 1620 for trading in silk and calico.

In 1912, Patna became the capital of Bihar and Orissa province when Bengal Presidency was partitioned. Patna played a significant role in the Indian Independence struggle. Mahatma Gandhi launched his first non-violent 'Satyagrah' movement in India against the Indigo Plantation in the Champaran district of Bihar. The success of this movement was the beginning of his tremendous and historic political journey. Bihar threw up great national leaders like Deshratna Dr Rajendra Prasad, the first President of the Republic of India, and Loknayak Jayaprakash Narayan, among many others.

Many languages are spoken in Patna. Hindi and Urdu are the official languages. The native dialects are Magahi, Bhojpuri, Maithili, and Angika. Other languages widely spoken in Patna are Bengali and English.

#### FEDERATION OF JESUIT ALUMNI ASSOCIATIONS OF INDIA

The first Jesuit school was opened in Goa in 1543. It was named St. Paul's College. Nothing exists of this institution today except its memory, but it was the predecessor of hundreds of other schools and colleges that are spread all over the country.

The Jesuits are involved in multiple activities in their attempts at nation building in India through continuity with past traditions and new initiatives. Jesuits in India now run more than 400 primary, middle schools, and high schools, 50 university colleges, 22 technical institutes, and 17 business administration institutes, 4 Universities with more than 15,000 teachers, educating more than 4 lakh students belonging to different religious, linguistic, and socioeconomic groups. Many of the Jesuit institutions are among the most reputable, and their share in the country's educational undertaking is substantial.



Jesuit institutions are committed to the cause of social justice and peace in a global milieu. The founder of the Society of Jesus, Saint Ignatius wrote in his treatise titled Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola that 'Man is created to praise, reverence and serve God our Lord and by this means to save his soul'. The resolve to work 'for the greater glory of god' has ensured their nurturing presence in the remotest and most deprived parts of the globe. In the field of education Jesuits are committed to the intellectual, spiritual and moral growth of students into a 'whole person'.

Fr. Pedro Arrupe was the Jesuit General from 1965 to 1983. He was a charismatic person who experienced the miseries of the poor people in Japan during 2nd World War and afterwards. When he became the General of the Jesuits, he carried with him a wealth of experience and these formed his future plans and actions. He felt that the Jesuit Alumni can be organized into a power that can change the poor people all over the world. With this idea in his mind, he asked all the Jesuit Provincials to start Alumni Association in their schools, colleges and other educational institutions.

He wanted to change the Jesuit Alumni into "Men and Women for others" and thus the Jesuit Alumni Association started. On the top level, we have the World Union of Jesuit Alumni/ae (WUJA) with headquarters at Spain. On the country level, we have Federation of Jesuit Alumni Association of India (JAAI) in India with headquarters at Kolkata. The Federation of Jesuit Alumni Associations of India (JAAI) is an association of all alumni associations of Jesuit academic institutions in India and is affiliated to World Union of Jesuit Alumni (WUJA). It hopes to bring together all Jesuit alumni in the country together and direct their energies for the betterment of the society. As beneficiaries and inheritors of the Jesuit/Ignatian legacy of Education, the members of several Alumni/ae Associations have come together to form a Federation, bonded in love and fellowship, endeavour to become men and women for others.

#### COMPANIONS OF JESUS FOR A JUST AND HUMANE SOCIETY...

The Society of Jesus founded by St. Ignatius Loyala in the 16th century is associated with education throughout the world and notably in India. The vision of Jesuit education got its inspiration from the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. St. Francis Xavier arrived in India in 1541 and organized the first Jesuit school in India, His name lives on today in many schools, colleges and institutes of advanced training throughout the subcontinent.

The First World War forced the German priests in India to return to their homeland. On September 10th 1919, Pope Benedict XV established the Diocese of Patna and made Bishop Van Hoeck, S.J., its first Bishop. Bishop Van Hoeck invited the Missouri Jesuits to come and work in Patna. Five Missouri Jesuits - Frs. William Eline, SJ, Henry Milet, SJ, Edward Anderson, SJ, Patrick Troy, SJ, and Thomas Kelly, SJ. - arrived in Patna on 16th March 1921. These first Jesuits of Patna, along with the work of looking after the Catholics, felt the need of starting good schools. They opened Khrist Raja High School in Bettiah in 1927. In 1940 Fr. Loesch, S.J., the then Superior of Patna Jesuits, asked Fr. Marshal to start St. Xavier's School in Patna. In 1942 the Patna Jesuits started St. Xavier's Jaipur, in 1950 St. Xavier's Kathmandu, in 1960 St. Xavier's Delhi and in 1969, took over St. Michael's Patna from Irish Brothers. Frs. Loesch, Moran, Niesen, Wrobleswski, Cleary and Murphy were outstanding Jesuit teachers of St. Xavier's, Patna and St Michael's, Patna. Through the years it has built up a reputation for excellence in the education and for preparing the students to distinguish themselves by selfless service to humanity and to lead lives in keeping with the school motto "For God and Country". Last year, Patna Jesuit Mission celebrated 100 years of blessings and transforming lives.

It has also one of the oldest school alumni associations in India - St. Xaviers Alumni Association (SXAA), Patna - celebrating its Platinum Jubilee this year. St. Xavier's Alumni Associations, St. Michael's Alumni Association, having a rich legacy of 164 years, and St. Xavier's College of Education Alumni Association are registered members of the JAAI and recently Alumni Association of St. Xavier's Higher Secondary School Bettiah - Xavier's Alumni Association of Bettiah - has also been formed and registered with JAAI. Other Jesuit Institutions of Patna Province - St. Xavier's College of Management and Technology Patna, Khrist Raja High School Bettiah, Catholic High School Ara, St. Ignatius High School Aurangabad, St. Ann's High School Sasaram, Raj Rajeshwar High School Barbigha, St. Thomas High School Ratanpurwa, St. Xavier's High School Gaunaha are also having Alumni Association and reinforcing togetherness.
