



Reaching out to Prisoners

At the initiative taken by Edmund Frank member of the SACAA Executive Council a five-month Diploma Course in Ayurvedic Medicines and Disease Prevention was inaugurated inside the District Prison in Mangaluru is on for the inmates of the District Prison in Mangalore in accordance with a MOU signed by the Vice Chancellor, St Aloysius (Deemed To Be University) Rev Dr Praveen Martis SJ and the Prison Superintendent Mr T Obaleshappa. This course is conducted under the guidance of the District Legal Services Authority and St Aloysius (Deemed to Be University) Mangaluru mainly with the intention of bringing a transformation of the mind of captives in prison. This programme is organized with the twin objective of empowering the prison inmates with some skills in order that they earn a decent living after their release from prison and that they and their families live a dignified life. The second objective is to help them in their rehabilitation after their release so that they do not go back to crime. This course consists of 100 sections of 90 minutes each, 60 per cent demonstrations and practicals and 40 per cent theory. Qualified Ayurvedic Doctors are appointed as faculty members. This is a first such programme organized inside prisons across India and also in the world. A text book for the trainees is written by Prof. Edmund Frank in Kannada titled "Herbal Medicines and Disease Prevention"



A similar practical training was organized from October 2023 and February 2024 in "Integrated Agriculture and Organic Farming" inside the District Prison in Mangaluru. 32 Prison inmates were awarded Diplomas



Introduction

Following the review of the brand narrative proposal at the Tokyo meeting, two ways of understanding WUJA's essence have emerged that require clarification before proceeding with the process. To avoid biases in the nomenclature of the words "vision," "purpose," and "mission," it is proposed to read these lines through Simon Sinek's "Golden Circle" model, which consists of three concentric circles:

1. Why: The core of the circle. Represents the fundamental reason for existence, the purpose or cause behind what is done. Sinek says successful companies and leaders start at this level, conveying their authentic purpose.

2. How: Explains how something is done- the process or method that differentiates an organization or leader from others. This circle connects with the value proposition.

3. What: The outer part of the circle describes what a company does: the products, services, or tangible results.
